

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

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The purpose of this report card is to provide a snapshot of student achievement at Clara Brownell Middle School for the 2015-2016 school year. The data listed in this report card will help us identify where we need to focus our instructional efforts and make changes.

While we would like to see all students making growth in all content areas, we are providing more focused curriculum and supports for students in math. This year, we have added additional math intervention classes to our master schedule (in addition to our current reading intervention classes) which allows for a double dose of math for students who need math instruction beyond their core math class. We have also adopted a new math curriculum with an online testing component which diagnoses students and assigns learning activities at each student's individual performance level.

We will also be implementing a school-wide focus on literacy. All content area teachers will strategically focus on reading and writing strategies in their classrooms.
We will continue to put all of our efforts and resources toward improving learning for each student. We ask that parents and families help with this goal by monitoring their child's homework, being present at activities and events, volunteering, checking student grades and communicating with teachers regularly. We look forward to working with our families to make sure all of our students reach their full potential.

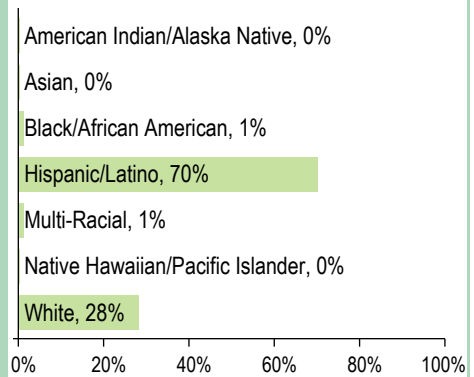

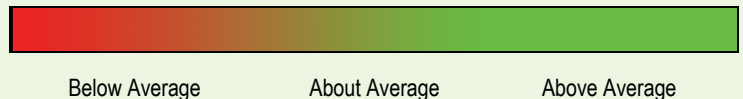
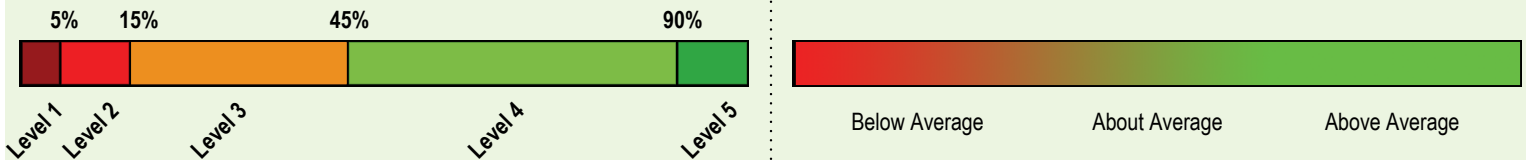
